INTRODUCTION

Sarboday sangha is a voluntary, non-Profit organization working in the areas of rural development, Mother and child care & education, women empowerment through advocacy, direct programme intervention and capacity building of the community to access the benefits of the state programmes. In 1973 an autonomous non-profit organization was established with an objective to provide services to the poor people and marginalized people of Khejuri Block I & II of Purba Medinipur district in west Bengal. During its long years of operation it has implemented a number of training and advocacy programmes for the people. Since last 41 years, Sarboday Sangha has been imparting comprehensive support to the rural people to resolve the social difficulties like illiteracy, unemployment and poor health condition. The major intention is to enlighten them with knowledge and to created opportunities for further sustainable development. We have adequate human resources to maintain and handle projects, organizational administration, financial management, fund raising and public relations.

OUR VISSION

To make a sustainable and substantial difference to the lives of the people living in the society in terms of their socio-economic development and look forward to a society where the people will access to equal opportunities and enjoy equal rights.

That is why the aim of all our projects is integrated towards a holistic sustainable development strategy which consists in dealing with socio-economic and environmental issues. 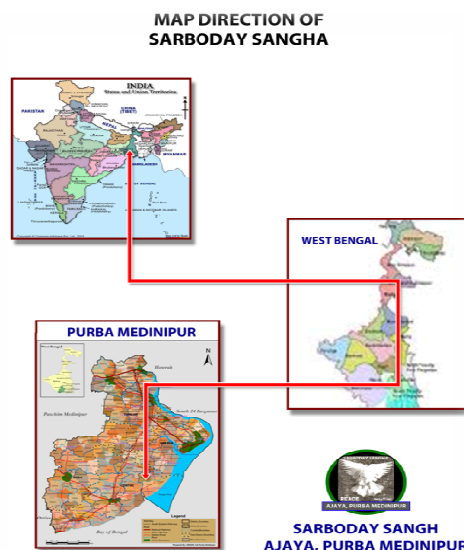

OPERATIONAL AREA

Sarboday Sangha is presently restricted to one district, which is Purba Medinipur; near the coastal belt of what is popularly known as contain sub-division. Now a day's Sarboday Sangha looking forward for new area of entire west Bengal. i.e. Paschim Medinipur and jalpaiguri (tea garden and hill areas)

Aims and Objectives of Sarboday Sangha

- ❖ To initiate the awareness building process and thus build up the Community Based Organization (CBO) and the capacity of the people.
- ❖ To work with the community people, Poor people, Marginalized and poorest of the poor in an open and transparent way.
- ❖ Women empowerment up to their full potential and assure them their rightful place in the society.
- ❖ By using people's participation sarboday sangha try to integrate and sustain models of Community Health and Rural development.
- ❖ To provide Education and Other alternatives for integrated development of the Children, Specially the Girl Child.
- ❖ To provide systematic health, hygiene and nutrition programmes and other easily accessible facilities.

- ❖ Networking with all stakeholders for the better service delivery.
- ❖ Application of improved livelihood principles.
- ❖ Application of bottom up methodology.
- ❖ Promote and Propagate community friendly new ideas & thoughts with great challenges.
- ❖ A specific improvisation through location specific intensive IEC campaign and involving women groups and civic individuals.

MODEL VILLAGE PROGRAMME

Model village programme is being carried out in the two villages, AJAYA & GOLABARI under the Gram Panchayet of Birbandar under Khejuri-I Block, District- Purba Medinipur. This project is going on from the year 2006. This project has two parts as under

- * **Community Health Programme**
- * **Education & Cultural Programme.**

Community Health Programme

This programme is aimed at raising the level of health of the poor and marginal community people of two villages described above with a special emphasis on mother and child. Keeping this in mind proper checking and monitoring is done on Routine Immunization (RI) and Pulse Polio Immunization. In our Sarboday sangha Campus there is arrangement for Homeopath and one Gynecologist to cover general and mother care respectively. We also supply medicine at low cost.



GOAL & OBJECTIVES:-

To reduce the Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) and the Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR) among the rural community.

- * To benefit all the families living in the village from the primary health care support service.
- * Common ailments to be identified and provide appropriate treatment at low cost.
- * Increase awareness level on general health among the community and reproductive health among the adult females.

ACTIVITIES

OPD CENTRE: -The rural health centre provides holistic health care support service apart from our regular awareness programmes and health checkups. Curative health services through linkages with sub-centers and block hospitals are provided to the rural community, especially to the poor. The OPD runs at Sarboday Campus from 11 A.M. to 5 P.M. One homeopath doctor and one Gynecologist provide their professional service to the villagers free of cost. Medicines are supplied at nominal cost.

VILLAGE HEALTH UNIT

This unit consists of our Health Workers and the service provided by them to the villagers covers both Ante Natal and Post Natal care (ANC &PNC) and checkups of pregnant women and immunization of the children through a follow-up directly in the households. Their activities could be classified as described below:

- Campus on basic Health & Hygiene, mother & Child care covering Routine Immunization and Pulse Polio Immunization, Adolescent Health.
- Identification of the Pregnant mothers at the first trimester and registration in the local government sub-centre.
- Minimum health service to the pregnant mothers (e.g. ensuring maximum institutional deliveries with the participation of a skilled staff for delivery).

- Reference of all critical cases to the Block primary Health Centre(BPHC) for secondary check-up and treatment by a quality doctor.
- Mobilization of the community to access the curative health service from government health centers.
- Establish linkage with Govt. health workers, Auxiliary Nurse Midwife, Auxiliary Welfare Worker (AWW) to maximize accessibility of Govt. health service to the community.
- Our health workers establish linkages with Panchayet Raj Institution (PRI) and sensitize them to ensure Panchayet involvement in the health program. The PRI members also take in different health trainings which have been designed according to the government training module.
- They also conduct training programmes for SHG members to cater health related information. In this way some SHG members also shoulder the role and responsibilities and share the experiences in this regard.

IMPACTS:

- * The new born Baby is kept adjacent to their mother's body to keep the baby warm.
- * The mothers provide Cholustrum to their new born baby and they practice exclusive BREAST FEEDING at least for 7 month.
- * There was no case of Polio and other 6 fatal diseases due to proper monitoring & checking of Routine Immunization and pulse Polio Vaccination.
- * The Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) and the Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR) among the rural community is zero for few years.

EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL PROGRAMME

Project Objectives:

- To decrease the numbers of school dropouts and get them back to the main stream of education.
- To motivate their Parents /Guardian to arrange for their education so that their children can be a respectful member of the society.
- In addition to their formal education by following the curriculum, our aim is also to make them culturally upgraded member of a just and humane society. Some educational tour programmes are organized for this purpose.

A Cultural Training Centre in the name of CHHANDAM KALA KENDRA was established in 1996 for Song, Dance and other Performing arts. SANSKRITI CHAKRA, an amateurish culture team was established with all the initiatives of Sarboday Sangha. Renowned Dance and Music professionals are appointed for the training of our students in Sarboday Kala Niketan. We are also running a class for Fine Arts.

IMPACTS:

- 88 students coming from poor families are being given free study materials to prevent them from being dropout from school.
- 61 students coming from poor families are being given free coaching to prevent them from being dropout from school.
- 19 students from both Ajaya and Golabari village have under gone training for Dance.
- 42 students from Golabari and Ajaya village have under gone training for Drawing.
- A stipend Rs.200/month is awarded to 15 students (5boys and 10girls) who come from very poor families as well as very intelligent. Rs. 500/- per month awarded to 10 college students
- CHANDAM KALA KENDRA imparted training to the students and as a result, this year, there are 22 students received training on Music, 15 on Dance,7 on Tablas, 35 on Arts & 15 for gymnastics.

SARBODAY SHISHU SHIKSHA MANDIR

A nursery school was started in 1991 with the experience that formal school system imparts quality education to a privileged few, while hundreds are less fortunate to get virtually nothing at all. We had been involved in opening up a school for youngsters to produce a healthy mix of children from all social, economic and religious backgrounds. Today the total strength of this school is 250. In addition to the formal curriculum students are also taught Classical, Creative, Bratachari, Gymnastics and Regional Dances on regular basis. The average student's attendance is about 96%. There is a children Library and the children themselves have the entire responsibility of running libraries. In this school the children from committees to oversee the cleaning work, sports and games. There are 11 teachers and 1 non teaching staff. There also a children park named SUHAS CHOUDHURY MEMORIAL CHILDREN PARK, where every children of the school plays. They had been trained on our various innovative approaches and methods primarily on the job. They also get exposure to various sources for informal training.

IMPACTS:

- * Student's strength has been increase d from 225 to 250 in the current project period.
- * Academic Science and Culture Promotion Society, 294/3APC Road, Kolkata-700009 searches for Science Talent in West Bengal. In the current project period 21 of our students have been selected.
- * 8 of our students received scholarship awarded by Primary Education Development Board.
- * 11 of our students received scholarship.

Creche

This is a program going under CSWB (central social welfare board) since 26 years at our organization. In this program one day care school is running for 0 to 5 years children whose father and mother engaged in a work at day time. In this school one leady teacher and one cook take care of children for whole day. School started at 9-30 am and closed at 4-30 pm. The children are learnt various things with play method without any difficulties. At present time 25 nos of child coming per day at day care school.

Rogi sahayak Kendra

This is like a help center for rogi and their family members. It started with the help of state health department of west Bengal government. We give facilities for RSBY card holder at KAMARDA BLOCK PRIMARY health centre at khejuri- I block, Purba Medinipur district and also help patient's family member for any type of information about doctor and their sections and also give information of the patients.

SMILE FOUNDATION CAPITAL COST PROGRAMME:

Project Title: Infrastructure and Facilities Development of the School Children

Project Area/location: KHEJURI-1 BLOCK (Sarboday Sishu Siksha Mandir)

Project objectives:

- Improved children's development readiness to start primary school on time.
- Improved education status of target children under different villages of Khejuri-I block of Contai subdivision under East Medinipur district.
- Increased awareness regarding the need of education through the creation of 16 communities based Peer Groups.
- Increased awareness on child protection at different levels of the society by enabling it regarding the rights of the children.
- Development of Nursery School.
- Evolve programmes for education at primary levels and Non-formal Education for school dropouts, out of school children, working children, adolescent girls and adults.
- Eliminate Child Labour and Rehabilitate the affected children.
- Provide Vocational Training to increase employment opportunities for the youth, adolescent girls and women and promote Income Generating Programmes (IGP).

- **Challenges:**

- 1. First of all we don't get all guardians together, because they work at outside of their village. So they could not attend the PTM.
- 2. Many of the families' economic condition are very low. So, so many students are dropout from school.
- 3. For this reason child Labour and dropout student level highly increasable.

- **Solution:**

- 1. Door to door visit and aware the parents continuously.
- 2. Counseling the parents and students and admit into school.
- 3. Mothers meeting in village area at least two days in a week about child right to education.
- 4. Regularly arrange PTM.
- 5. Ensure participation of parents in PTM.

SMILE FOUNDATION NUTRITION PROGRAMME:

Project Area/location: SARBODAY SISU SIKHA MANDIR, AJAYA, KHEJURI, PURBA MEDINIPUR

Targeted number of beneficiaries: 150 NOS. OF STUDENTS

Project objectives:

- ✱ All student get nutritious food.

- ✱ Regularity of the students.
- ✱ Regularity hand washes of the students.

Benefit from the Nutrition Programme

- Students learn hand washing before eating food.
- Students are clean.
- All Students get learnt joyfully.

NDLM

"Digital Literacy is the ability of individuals and communities to understand and use digital technologies for meaningful actions within life situations".

OVERVIEW OF NDLM: In line with the objective of the National Policy on IT 2012 to make one person in every household in the country e-literate, a scheme for IT Mass Literacy (now renamed as National Digital Literacy Mission/ Digital Saksharta Abhiyan) has been approved. Making one person in every family digitally literate is one of the integral components of the Prime Minister vision of "Digital India". The objective is to impart basic ICT skills relevant to the need of the trainees, which would enable the citizens to use IT and related applications and participate actively in the democratic process and further enhance opportunities for their livelihood. The persons shall be able to access information, knowledge and skill through the use of digital devices.

Our aims:

To make 42.5 lakh persons digitally literate at two levels in Duration of 4 years and 38.5 lakh Candidates by Government & 4 Lakh by Industries/NGOs/others under CSR Inclusion of Aanganwadi Workers, Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs), Authorized Ration Dealers as key beneficiaries at All over west Bengal.

CREATION OF SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURE AND DURABLE ASSETS FOR RURAL YOUTH

"Health is wealth" and Sports & fitness is the way of happy and healthy life. In our rural area have no infrastructure for exercise and sports for youth and also old aged people for their healthy life. Presently we have seen that many people of our rural area suffering various types of diseases so we aiming to decrease this tendency we want to create of sports infrastructure & durable assets

Our aims:

- In this rural area the participants will be highly delighted and they will be active energetic and they will more interested in playing games.
- Players will rise up to new skills new thinking, new ideas.
- Infrastructure is helpful to create new talent among youths.
- Equipments may create for reaching influence on the villagers attending on stadium the villagers will burst into joy and will be more interested to take part in the indoor games.
- In brief development of play ground will bring a new era to the local people. Attending in the play ground the common people will be able to learn many things which will be helpful to every happy life.

SARBODAY PUBLIC ACADEMY

Sarboday Sangha started a co-ed. Primary teacher's training institution for rural students those who are not able to get training from a reputed institution. This institution is recognized by NCTE and affiliated by west Bengal board of primary teacher's education from year 2014. Here is a hostel and library facility and also internet facility in the college campus. Every professor is cooperative with students at all time.

WATER SUPPLY, SANITATION & HYGIENE EDUCATION IN SCHOOL

School is very important and essential part for social development of children, so the Water Supply, Sanitation and Hygiene Education in School are very much necessary for safe, secure and healthy environment for the children to learn better and face the challenges of the future life. We had been implementing this activity from 2003, but it gathered momentum after the assistance of Water for People India, a Denver based NGO from USA. The purpose of this programme is to encompass with Water supply, Sanitation and hygiene Education in School Programme of Government of India, which actually integrates the broader sanitation facilities and have provision for safe drinking water. Also they should teach good and proper hygienic practice and behavior to the children.

GOAL & OBJECTIVES:-

- ❖ Make awareness generation among the students regarding utility of safe drinking water and its roll in sanitation from the very beginning of their childhood.
- ❖ Especially girl's students will have a better environment to continue their education.
- ❖ Children will adopt improved hygiene practices to know and prevention of water born and sanitation related diseases.
- ❖ To enhance the water and sanitation related hygiene practices among the school children and individually communicating the knowledge and practice to the whole communities.
- ❖ To provide additional support for up gradation and extension of the existing Sanitary Blocks of 43 targeted schools.
- ❖ To provide maintenance management mechanism for lengthy sustainability of those schools Sanitary Blocks
- ❖ To make the School premises user friendly for children, especially adolescent girls,in terms of water and sanitation service facilities to prevent their dropping out.

EXPECTED OUTCOME:-

- Increase attendance of girl student in school through setting up toilet facilities for girls. I.e. setting up double unit toilets.
- School students will practice safe hygienic behavior.
- Trained the selected school teachers as School sanitation, hygiene education (SSHE) facilitator so that they continue the programme in the days to come.
- Develop a team on Mason who will be expert in building Sanitary marts in rural environment.

IMPACT:-

From Feb.2011 we started a JALABANDHU Project in Khejuri-II Block, under which altogether 7nos local person (1 from Baratala,1 form Khejuri,1 from Janka and 2 from Nijkasba) were trained in repairing of hand pumps, similar of which are situated in the villages in those GPs. They are under GP pay roll, but during training period we also paid them @ Rs.500 /month. In thE year(2012) we also started another Block of Khejuri I,e. Khejuri-I Block.here 8nos person of local people (1 from Heria,1 from Lakhi,1 from Kamarda,1 from Kalagachia,2 from Tikashi and 2 from Birbandar) are trained in repairing of hand pump. They started their work very freshly. The community will be benefited as the villagers will not be dependent on the contractors from outside and they will get speedy and promote service from them whenever any hand pump is found faulty.Now they are working properly in their gram Panchayet with the help of gram Pradhan & Panchayet.

OUR UNIQUE CONCEPT: - The CHANGE ROOM concept in the girls toilet block at school is our unique concept and education for all girl child

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT AND MICRO-CREDIT PROJECT

GOAL:

- ❖ To try to make sure that the women, particularly from marginalized section of the community get the rightful place in the society.
- ❖ To create the platform on social solidarity and financial service delivery to empower the women.
- ❖ A comfortable status in the society for women.

OBJECTIVES:

- To build capacities of women groups (SHGs) about record keeping, banking process and to raise their social issues through these groups.
- To sensitize men and women on various issues related with gender equality.
- To make women legally aware by training them on specific law articles such as marriage Act, Child Marriage Act, Right to Education Act and Right to Information Act.
- To organize women of this area and increase their access to government schemes and other rights related with their well being.
- To incorporate habit of savings in women to make them economically independent.

ACTIVITIES:

Organization of the women in SHGs:

A Self-Help Group (SHG) is a community group, consisting of local women. SHGs represent a powerful tool for improving quality of life in a community. They are a prime example of how community participation and empowerment can alleviate poverty. SHGs act as change agents in communities, addressing a wide range of community issues such as livelihood, family planning, education, health and nutrition. Now a day's also they promote leadership, participation, social mobilization, empowerment and collective decision making.

The strategy for sustainable result is the organization of women into the SHGs- 10 to 20 members per group. As per organizational design, SHGs are organized at the village level through Participatory Rural Appraisal methodology for identification. In these SHGs, women discuss about the problems they encounter and try to find the solutions subsequently after understanding and analyzing the problem. The Sarbodaya Sangha workers extend their efforts to help them in this respect. It is also an easy way for the SS workers to organize meeting and therefore to communicate with the local people.

Initializations of the micro-Credit

The women in the SHGs have been initialized to the micro-Credit. Every month, women have to meet and to save little money (minimum: Rs.10). Because the SS workers have helped the SHGs to open a bank account, saving in a safe place is possible. Therefore, an internal circulation of funds in each SHG is done. The banks have their own criteria for sanction of CC limit to the groups, which includes current level of savings, regularity in the meetings, capability of the SHGs to maintain proper books of accounts and repayment performance of the group on internal as well as past loans. Loan disbursement decision rests with the group members jointly. Repayment schedule is flexible and decided by the group at the time of disbursement. Interest is charged at a rate of 15% per month on a reducing balance. The loan amount ranges from Rs.1, 000 to Rs.10,000 and in some exceptional cases, it is up to Rs.15, 000.

Monitoring:

This project is closely interconnected with the other organizational development programmes and is monitored by the Field Supervisors. The following elements are assessed:

- Creating livelihood opportunities through livestock, agriculture, fishery and home industries.
- Sustainability and revenue model.
- Scalability and expansion.
- Understand coverage and growth.
- Risk management
- Cost of the subsidy.
- Collaborations-leverage and Flexibility.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMMES:

- * Meeting with Village Committee and Group Leaders to discussion about social problems.
- * Meeting with PRI members at GP level, meeting with the personnel of the line department in the Block and District level to ensure peoples participation at all level of development.
- * Workshop on importance to attend Gram Sansad and Gram Sabha meetings so that the women can execute their democratic rights and also for effective use of decentralized planning.
- * Orientation training on disaster management, running of relief campus, streamlining logistic supports.

In addition we organized meetings with each of team including 40 persons comprising of community leaders, women leaders and Panchayet representatives, where the discussions were on -

- ↪ Responsive local self-governance in rural and urban areas.
- ↪ Self-help to meet the immediate basic needs of the poor.
- ↪ Women's empowerment.
- ↪ Social cohesion focusing on efforts at raising awareness on entitlements, changes in institutions, discrimination and manage conflicts of interest towards accelerated poverty reduction.
- ↪ Policy advocacy (tribal rights, violence, environmental degradation).

OUTPUT:

- ➔ Availability of information at PRI and its increase use.
- ➔ Improve relationship with Administration for WASH, RCH, SGSY, Village Development Committee and Rogi Kalyan Samiti.
- ➔ As a result of regular visit made by members of SHG, Five VCDs and ICDS centers became regular.
- ➔ Near about 4000 women have been linked to women empowerment programme through micro-credit and self reliance.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE

Sarboday polytechnic Academy is a training centre imparting different technical knowledge to the community at a very low cost but with effective training.

OUR OBJECTIVES:

- ➔ The promotion of a just and human society, through empowerment of the disadvantaged and marginalized, specially the youth and women through relevant skills and competence.
- ➔ To encourage the families to take up the vocational training in on-farm skills which are functional in generating income.
- ➔ To mobilize support by forming linkages with government, non-government organizations and other institutions.

ACTIVITIES:

- ↪ Awareness generation meeting about ways of skill development, income generation and requirement.
- ↪ Market demand based vocational selection.
- ↪ Training on Marketing, Book-keeping and Micro-finance.
- ↪ 6 months course on DTP and CITA.
- ↪ Electrician course for basic repairing and House wiring also home connection.
- ↪ Training on Tailoring, Embroidery jute work drawing including Fabric and Batik Printing.

RESULTS:

- ⚙ 50 trainees have successfully completed their training on Fabric and Batik Printing and also have started earning of their own.
- ⚙ 15 Women are in a position to support their husbands financially.
- ⚙ 70 Youth have been trained in Basic Computer Course on Hardware and Software and they are already working in various cyber café in the nearby town of Contai and Mecheda

SARBODAY PUBLIC LIBRARY

Sarboday Public Library started in the year 2001. It is started with the help of some dedicated people of the area. They donated some books from their end and Sarboday Sangha buy some books from their end. Yearly some books are purchased from their own development fund. Some fund is coming from the District library of Purba Medinipur. Now the members of library are increased day to day. But now digital & electronic media is very essential for the library.

AMBULANCE SERVICE

An emergency ambulance service is provided to the villagers for taking the ailing patients to the nearby Health Centers and Hospitals whenever required. It also provided service like MATRIJAN or NISCHOYJAN PRAKALPA.

SUSTAINABLE FISHING PROGRAMME

This project is financed by MARINE PRODUCT EXPORT DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY-NETFISH (MPEDA-Net-Fish), with the active co-operation of MPEDA-NETFISH and financial assistance from Ministry of Commerce, Government of India. Awareness camps on processing, aqua culture; conservation and sustainable fishing being arranged covering fisherman living in the coastal area of Purba Medinipur district with street play, audio visual aids, discussion etc. Conservation camps are also been arranged for students of class IX & X in coastal area school.

GOAL:

To ensure a sustainable development programme with conservation of marine fishes and triggered as important livelihood options among fisherman communities.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- ↳ To organize appropriate training programmes to impart knowledge to the fisherman/fisherwoman/processing workers, technicians etc. in fish quality management, conservation of fish resources for sustainable fishing and issues relating to marine products.
- ↳ To function as a nodal agency for upgrading technology and quality management of fishing, fish processing sectors at grass root level, with a view to improving the quality of marine products.
- ↳ To network with stakeholder organization like fisherman societies, mechanized boat operators societies, fisherman federations and organization of processing and pre-processing workers etc, for having a uniform methodology.
- ↳ To received and expend project funds, maintain revolving accounts, enter into contracts and agreements, receive donations, provide service and deliver goods to beneficiaries.
- ↳ To facilitate public or private investment in infrastructure development.
- ↳ To forge or develop systematic linkages between national/state/district institutions of excellence in the field of extension and marketing.

- ↳ To induct competent and experienced technical experts and other skilled manpower available in the fisheries sector for executing the extension training programmes.

ACTIVITIES:

- ⊗ There were held 49 programmes on Fish Quality Management.
- ⊗ 32 programmes were held on Conservation and Sustainability of fishing catch.
- ⊗ 19 programmes were held on Boat of observation of different types of fisherman's activities like catching of fish, dumping and conservation activities etc.
- ⊗ 45 programmes were held in the training on Post Harvesting Aqua Culture.
- ⊗ 21 programmes were held in the training on Dry Fish Management.
- ⊗ 31 nos. of school student's awareness programme were held on Mangrove Plantation in Khejuri-II Block. The children coming from fisherman's family were given special attention.

AMBEDKAR HASTA-SHILPA VIKAS YOJANA

Sarboday sangha runs some training programme on skill and design development on BATIK (exclusively for women) and TERRACOTTA (mixed) with the kind help of Development commissioner (HANDICRAFT), Ministry of Textile, Government of India. The objectives of this project are to equip the willing members of the community to make them earn money by the focusing of flockculture design. The criteria of choosing them are their attitude and their economic background.

Project Objectives:

- The promotion of a just and humane society, through empowerment of the disadvantage and marginalized, specially the youth and women through relevant skill and competence.
- To encourage the families to take up the training on this particular livelihood skills which are functioning in generating income.
- To mobilize support by forming linkages with the Government, Non-government organization and other institutions.
- To function as a nodal agency for upgrading technology and quality management of the product at grass root level, with a view to improving the quality of the products.
- To forge or develop systematic linkages between national, state, districts institutions of excellence in the field of extension and marketing.
- To induct competent and experienced technical experts and other skilled manpower available in this sector for executing the extension training programmes.

ACTIVITIES:

- ↳ Two skill up gradation trainings on Batik Printing was held for a total of 40 (2x20) participants. The duration of duration of training was 4 months.
- ↳ Similarly two skill up gradation on Terracotta was held for a total of 40 (2x20) participants. The training was 4 months.
- ↳ Two Design Development Training in Batik section was held for a total of 60 (2x30) participants, similarly Design Development Training in Terracotta section was held for a total of 30 participants. Both of training was of 15 days duration.

IMPACTS:

- ↳ Skill up gradation training and design development Training was very helpful for the SHGs to learn the jobs practically, in this way they developed their self confidence.
- ↳ They have learned a new job and subsequently found a new way for earning their livelihood. They are also trying to keep in touch with the market. Their handicraft items have a great demand in the market.
- ↳ These women have also participated in the National Trade Fair, Salt Lake in Kolkata. Besides they have also taken part in the fair organized by local Gram Panchayat.
- ↳ These SHG members are imparting training to their untrained counterparts.

In order to market their products in a big way, they need a proper orientation on raw material procurement and marketing. We also have an intention to make a federation consisting of the Handicraft groups. In this way, they will get the incentives provided by the government and in future the individual members will be self-employed in a lucrative job.

KISHORI BAHINI TRAINING :

This year Sarboday Sangha organized one kishori Bahini training programme with the help of "Nistha" a voluntary organization, Baruipur, West Bengal.

- * Deduction of Early marriage
- * Reduce drop out of girls students
- * Education & cultural programme

- Formation of kishori bahini at three villages.
- Awareness meeting with the parents
- Stipend for drop out girls.
